CEASE AND DESIST ORDER

The above-entitled matter came for pre-hearing conference on August 24, 2017 pursuant to the Department of Business Regulation's ("Department") Order to Show Cause Why Order Should Not Issue to Cease and Desist Unlicensed Activities, Notice of Intent to Impose Administrative Penalties, Notice of Hearing, and Appointment of Hearing Officer ("Notice") issued by the Department on August 9, 2017 to Gary DiLorenzo d/b/a Mutual Auto Body, a/k/a Tony's Kustoms ("Respondent"). At the pre-hearing conference, the parties agreed to a temporary cease and desist order being entered against the Respondent in that the Respondent shall cease and desist from engaging in any unlicensed automobile body repair shop work pending a final resolution in this matter.

A hearing was held on December 14, 2018 pursuant to the Department's request to make the temporary cease and desist order permanent. At hearing, the Respondent did not object to the entering of a permanent cease and desist order. The Department represented that the underlying complaint in this matter had been resolved to the complainant's satisfaction. The Department represented that nothing precludes the Respondent from applying, if he so

chooses in future, to be licensed as an automobile body shop.

Based on the foregoing, it is orders as follows:

The Respondent shall cease and desist from engaging in any unlicensed automobile body repair shop work in violation of R.I. Gen. Laws § 5-38-1 *et seq*. in the State of Rhode Island.
