ORDER OF DISMISSAL


On March 12, 2015 the Department of Business Regulation (“Department”) issued an Order to Show Cause why License Should not be Revoked or Suspended, Notice of Pre-Hearing Conference and Appointment of Hearing Officer (“Order”) to Clearpath Wealth Management, LLC and Patrick Churchville, President (“Respondents”). At the time the Order was issued, the Respondents were licensed investment advisors in Rhode Island pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws § 7-11-101 *et seq.* The Department has jurisdiction on this matter pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws § 42-14-1 *et seq.*, R.I. Gen. Laws § 42-35-1 *et seq.*, and R.I. Gen. Laws § 7-11-101 *et seq.*

On April 2, 2015, a pre-hearing conference was held and a discovery schedule set. The Order was amended on June 29, 2015 pursuant to the Department’s motion to amend Order to which the Respondents did not object. A new discovery schedule was set. On July 30, 2015, the United States Federal District Court appointed a receiver for the Respondents on the basis of a motion by the Securities and Exchange Commission. During the course of these proceedings, Respondent Churchville was sentenced in March, 2017 to a term of imprisonment due to Federal charges.

On or about January 4, 2019, the Department withdrew its Order against the Respondent so that this matter may be dismissed.


Based on the foregoing, the undersigned recommends that this matter be dismissed.

LAWS § 42-35-15, THIS ORDER MAY BE APPEALED TO THE SUPERIOR COURT SITTING IN AND FOR THE COUNTY OF PROVIDENCE WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS OF THE MAILING DATE OF THIS DECISION. SUCH APPEAL, IF TAKEN, MUST BE COMPLETED BY FILING A PETITION FOR REVIEW IN SUPERIOR COURT. THE FILING OF THE COMPLAINT DOES NOT ITSELF STAY ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDER. THE AGENCY MAY GRANT, OR THE REVIEWING COURT MAY ORDER, A STAY UPON THE APPROPRIATE TERMS.
