

The Contractor was paid to perform the Remodel of the Kitchen and assorted fixture replacement, he took payment of \$11,500.00 approx. 1/3 of the contracted amount (\$31,500.00).

He began the demolition of the kitchen, including water disconnection and various electrical tinkering, and has not returned to the jobsite, he has avoided any communication attempted by the homeowner and myself at this point. Electrical wiring in the kitchen was left open, uncapped and the breaker was left on, creating a potentially dangerous situation.

On or about May 3, 2022, the respondent performed the start of a Kitchen Remodel, with demo work taking place.

Upon inspection, this work was deemed improper because (describe and cite standard)

He has not returned to the jobsite, he has avoided any communication attempted by the homeowner and myself at this point.
