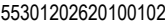

The Company maintains a noncontributory, defined contribution retirement plan. The plan covers all full-time employees who are 21 years of age and have completed three months of service with the Company.

Employees qualify for benefits upon normal retirement at age 65, or early retirement, which is met upon reaching age 60 and completion of five years of service. Vesting of contributions (made on behalf of each employee) begins the 20% after two years of service and increases 20% annually until full vesting occurs after six years of service. The Company's discretionary contributions to this plan, representing its full funding requirements, were \$649,910 for the period ended June 30, 2026, and \$937,950 for the period ended December 31, 2025.

Effective January 1, 1997, the Company established a 401(k) plan. Plan entry of employer contributions are the same as the defined contribution retirement plan described above. The Company’s contribution to the plan matches the first 1% of base compensation and 50% of additional contributions up to 6% of the base compensation that is contributed by each employee. Employer contributions vest 100% after two years of service. The Company’s contributions to this plan were \$218,019 for the period ended June 30, 2026, and \$411,686 for the period ending December 31, 2025.

B. Deferred Compensation Plans

In 2004, the Company established a 457(b) Plan to provide deferred compensation for a select group of management. The Company contributed \$55,121 through December 31, 2025. There were no contributions made in Q2 2026.

In 2009, the Company established a 457(f) Plan to provide deferred compensation for a select group of management. The Company made no contributions to the plan in 2025. There were no contributions made in Q2 2026.

C. Postretirement Benefit Plans

The Company provides post-retirement medical and dental benefits covering certain members of the board of directors who had served three full terms (total 9 years) as of April 1994. The Company accounts for postretirement benefits under the provisions of Statement of Statutory Accounting Principles (SSAP) No. 89, Accounting for Pensions, A Replacement of SSAP No. 8.

Actuary valuations were used to measure plan assets and obligations. The trend assumptions used in determining the accumulated postretirement benefit obligation were 5% for medical benefits and 3% for dental benefits. Trend assumptions have a significant effect on the amounts reported. There have been no significant changes since the December 2025 annual filing.

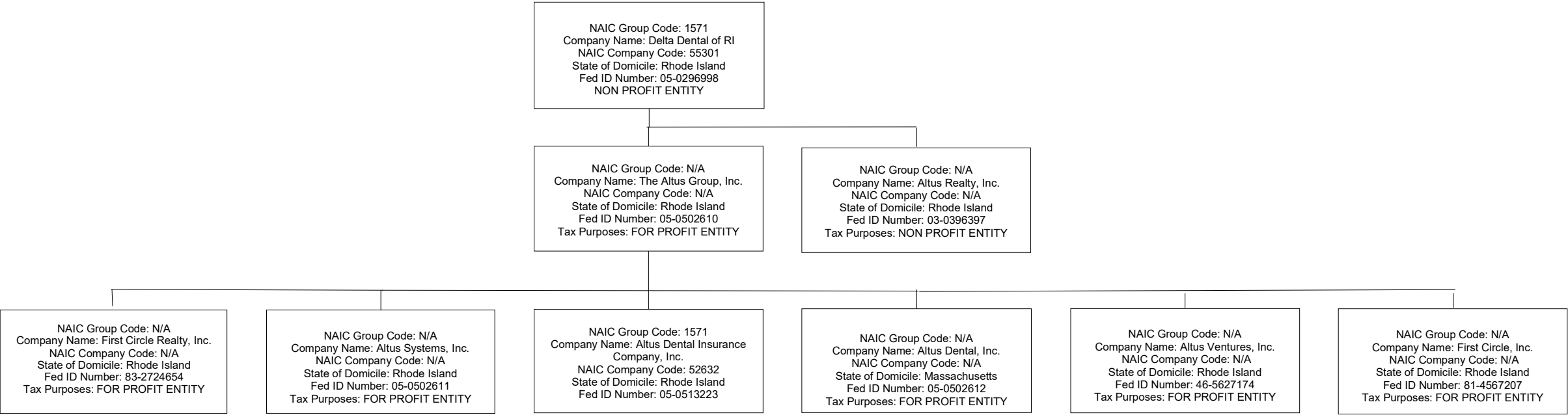
